ATV Clubs Educate Riders Wherever They Find Them (Even on closed trails)



ATV Clubs take personal ownership of the Grant-in-Aid trails they build and maintain. They work long and hard to keep them fun and safe for the riding public, and sustainable both economically and environmentally.

The number of ATVs registered in Minnesota is increasing at a rate of about 3% each year, or roughly 9,000 vehicles.

Also on the rise, it seems, are the number of first-time owners who aren't bothering to educate themselves before they ride on the State ATV Trails. This presents a challenge to ATV club volunteers, who find themselves educating riders not just in their organized ATV Safety Classes and at community events but, in some cases, while doing trail maintenance. Calmly informing ATV owners of the rules of the trail, some who don't bother to learn the DNR regulations, others who simply don't care to abide by them.

Case in point last Saturday: One day after the official opening of a popular ATV trail system in central Minnesota, the club that maintains it was hauling rock to fill in some wet areas on a stretch of Class-1 only trail. Within 5 hours, they had to turn back 19 Class 2 side-by-sides. The drivers ignored two signs: one that states the trail

is for Class 1 ATVs only, another that read "Trail closed for maintenance." One of the drivers was on a Class 2 that measured 77 inches wide, too wide to legally ride on any State ATV Trail. A club member stopped what he was doing and kindly asked the driver if he knew the trail was for Class 1 ATVs only. His response, astonishing the trail workers, was: "What's a Class 1?"



Patience, Positivity, Perseverance

Those are the 3 P's of trail building - often a long and challenging process.

More and more, the same three words may apply to ATVAM and its many ATV member clubs, as we all try our best to educate riders wherever we find them, in order to protect our right AND their right to ride.

DNR Allows "Dispersed Camping" In State Forests Under New Walz Order



Here is the latest on "dispersed camping," allowed starting May 18th in State Forests, including at some of the widely spaced campsites along Forest Roads that wind through OHV Trail Systems.

Camping in sites with no fire ring or picnic table, along Forest Roads in Spider Lake Trails and Nemadji Trails for example, is allowed.

No fire ring or picnic table? Allowed.



Campsite with amenities? Not allowed.

But camping in sites with tables or fire rings, or within a mile of a developed State Forest campground (which are still closed), is not allowed.

It's unclear how far DNR Conservation Officers will enforce "dispersed camping" based on the DNR definition.

According to an email sent to ATVAM by the DNR, vault toilets will remain closed at OHV trailheads until cleaning protocols are put in place.

UPDATE ON DNR CAMPING:

Dispersed camping will be allowed in state forests beginning Monday, May 18. Dispersed camping:

- ◆ Is limited to a single household.
- ◆ Has no amenities - no toilets, water pumps, fire grates, trashcans, or picnic tables.
- ◆ Must be done at least one mile outside of designated campsites or campgrounds on state forest land.
- ◆ Does not require a reservation.

DNR Adjusts Grant-In-Aid Manual In Response To Pandemic Conditions



The Minnesota DNR has made temporary amendments to the Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) Grant-In-Aid Manual. The Parks and Trails Division has shared the new document with all ATV clubs and sponsors, and has posted it on its website on the GIA page. In an email to ATVAM, Paul Purman, Parks and Trails OHV Program Consultant, explains the adjustments:

From Paul Purman:

These amendments are fairly minor in nature, and are intended to be used in a pandemic environment in close consultation with the DNR Parks and Trails Area Supervisor that trail administrators typically work with. The importance of communication and coordination with the Area

Supervisor is strengthened in this document. In short, here are the changes, which took effect yesterday (May 4), and will expire on June 30, 2021 unless extended:

- Pandemic Best Practices: Provides some additional information for clubs and sponsors to consider when doing their trail work regarding safe practices in the pandemic environment, including some specific information on when face masks must be worn.
- Limited flexibility in travel reimbursements: Identifies that DNR PAT Area Supervisors have the authority to approve increased reimbursements for normally allowed travel to and from the project area specifically to support effective social distancing, even if these reimbursements would exceed the budgeted administrative amounts and/or go above the normal 15% cap on administrative charges outlined in the Program Manual.
- Changes in work plans: Acknowledges that sponsors and clubs need to evaluate the importance of tasks that require close contact, and delay or forgo tasks when appropriate. Emphasizes that they need to keep DNR Area Supervisor informed of proposed changes to work plan resulting from COVID19 concerns.
- Short term delays in trail openings: Affirms that if a sponsor and/or club believe current pandemic conditions justify a short term delay to the opening of a trail, to please contact the DNR Parks and Trails Area Supervisor immediately to discuss.
- Signage: Acknowledges that public health may be enhanced by clubs and sponsors posting additional signage to support social distancing.
- Portable toilet reimbursement (non-pandemic): Clarifies that the current grant agreement allows portable toilet services to be reimbursed at up to 90%. **I hope that these temporary changes will provide some clarity and tools to support enhanced health for the riding public, OHV clubs, and sponsors during this time of pandemic.**
