

Ride Rules, Trail Etiquette


1. Check-In at Registration - Arrive 1/2 hour before your ride leaves – Check in with Ride Leader.
2. If born after July 1, 1987, and you are 16 years or older, you must have an ATV Safety Certificate.
3. Riders age 12-15 need an ATV Safety Certificate and must be accompanied by parent or legal guardian in separate machine.
4. Only Class 1 (less than 50") and Class 2 (50" to 65") ATVs will be allowed on guided rides.
5. Ride with your lights on - It is a state law.

6. All riders and passengers under 18 years old must wear a D.O.T. approved helmet.
7. Get to know the rider behind you and in front of you.
8. You are responsible for the rider behind you. If you lose sight of them, pull over to the right side of the trail and wait.
9. Wait at intersections to see if the rider behind you is following.
10. Always stay with your group, don't ride off-trail.
11. Pull over to the right and ride slowly for any approaching riders.
12. Give yourself plenty of following distance to ensure adequate stopping.
13. Understand and obey all MN Off-Highway Vehicle Regulations and local ATV ordinances.
14. Maintain a speed of less than 30 mph on all County or Township Road connections
15. Follow posted speed limits if less than 30 mph.
16. Yield for all pedestrians, and slow down in residential areas.
17. Practice "Ride Sober" and hold off using any alcohol or chemicals that affect your driving abilities.
18. Wear your seat belt if equipped.
19. Stay on the Trail, and on far right on all township & county roads.

Speak as if everyone is listening.

Ride as if everyone is watching.



Remembering Minnesota State Senator David Tomassoni

Senator David J. Tomassoni, 69, of Chisholm, Minn, died on August 11, 2022, as a result of his battle with ALS. For the last 30 years, his passion for the people of Chisholm and the Iron Range was second to none. Sen. Tomassoni was a good and dear friend of Minnesota's ATV clubs and riders. He worked with ATV Minnesota throughout his service in the Minnesota Legislature, including the House of Representatives (1992-2000) and the State Senate (2000-2022). His strong support over the years helped ensure that ATV riding in Minnesota is considered a legitimate and great sport for its citizens and the state's economy. While always supporting our policy pursuits, he was particularly instrumental in passing budgetary legislation for trail development in northern Minnesota. The next time you are riding on an ATV trail anywhere in Minnesota, please tip your cap in honor of our long-time supporter and friend, Senator Tomassoni.



ATV MN Promotes Trails, Safety At Two Major Events

Each year, ATV Minnesota joins the other three motorized State Associations to promote trails, safety and responsible riding at two big events. The Coalition of Recreational Trail Users (3 members from ATV MN, MnUSA, MN4WDA and ARMCA/AMA District 23), set up the group's Education Trailer at the **State Fair**

during Trails Day, August 25th, visiting with fair goers, answering questions and passing out reg books, trail maps and other helpful materials.



Three days later, on August 28th, they did it again at the **Youth Outdoor Activity Day, held in Alexandria, Minn.** It's a free family-friendly event that provides a fun environment for youth to learn about outdoor recreation. Hosted and organized by two non-profit groups, Viking Sportsmen Inc. and Douglas County Pheasants Forever, it's made possible through a consortium of participating volunteer organizations, businesses, individuals, and donors.

Also at that event, the **Runestone Off-road ATV Riders club (ROAR)** gave young people rides in their SxSs, for many of the youth their first off-road ride, and visited with parents about riding ATVs safely and responsibly. (Photo from 2021 event)






Unfortunately, They Are Out There.

The North Woods Quads, Hill City, put up a sign on a trail shelter they recently dedicated to Harlan Kingsley (in photo at new shelter). Then someone stole it. If you know who took it, or see it in someone's garage or barn, or on social media, please let us or the club know.

And from the Hill City Police Department:

ATVers, we are very fortunate to have some awesome trails around here and some even more awesome clubs that take care of them, we for the most part leave ATVers alone but we have seen an uptick in traffic on the state highways in and around town. **State law does NOT allow ATVs on the highways.** There is one spot east of town on Hwy 200 where you leave the trail, cross a bridge and get back on the trail, other than that you cannot drive on the State Highways of 169 and 200. You are welcome to use the city and county streets to get around but just because it's only 2 blocks or a shorter distance to the gas station or restaurant you still cannot ride on the highways. You can cross at a 90 degree angle to get across the highway but we are seeing more and more ATVers cruising down the highways. We don't want to resort to ticketing but it's for your safety and other vehicles. Any questions feel free to reach out to us at the PD and we can either answer your question or get you in touch with the DNR. Have a safe and enjoyable fall.
